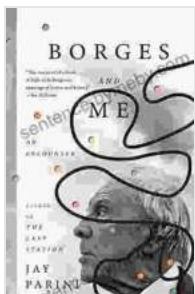


Borges and Me: A Literary Interlude I Will Never Forget
